## PRINCIPAL'S NOTE

### **Narrabundah College's Improvement Agenda to take us into the next 5 Years.**

The Education Directorate has just released its Workforce Strategy for the next 3 years. This strategy overarches everything that happens in our schools.

Their goal is to support our teachers to deliver quality learning experiences for all students in schools where they love to learn.

In our Strategic Plan our priorities, which will be signed off this term, are positioned within the Directorate's Strategic Plan and reflect our system agenda:

- Priority 1: Improve student engagement in learning
- Priority 2: Improve student learning

So how are we going to develop and implement our priorities?

Our Executive Team has just attended the Annual Leadership Symposium facilitated this year by Professor Helen Timperley and Dr Linda Bendikson both educational leaders in making changes in schools to improve outcomes for students.

In our new Strategic Plan we are developing strategies to ensure that students' agency and voice are evident in all classes and that students will be able to demonstrate ownership of their learning. Additionally it is crucial that our students proactively seek support required to address their learning, connection to their environment and strengthen their resilience.

Our goal is to improve outcomes for all students.

### **International Baccalaureate Information Evening for Prospective Students 2022**

This evening attracted very strong interest and was extremely well attended by more than 350 parents/carers and their children.

The numbers in the programme are increasing and there is clearly considerable interest by the community in this curriculum offering.

All curriculum offerings at this college: the IB Curriculum, ACT/Australian Curriculum (T/A) and the French Baccalauréat allow our students to undertake rigorous and substantial preparation for undergraduate courses or the workplace both in Australia and overseas.

This session will be finishing up this Thursday. Students and staff will enjoy a well-deserved holiday for the next two weeks.

### **Session 2 Beginning Monday 19 April**

The first week back to college begins with a Feedback Day for our students to meet with their teachers and take on board feedback from their Session 1 assessments.

It is crucial that students learn from the feedback they receive in order to improve their outcomes.

Year 11 Students may choose to effect changes to their classes based on this feedback. They must discuss any proposed course changes with their parents and the Student Adviser.

I look forward to meeting you at the Year 11 Information Evening to be held in the Hawk Theatre at 6pm Tuesday April 20 on: **What do Scores and Grades Mean?** at which we will explain the scores and grades on the recently received reports and introduce the ATAR.

This will be followed by the Parent Teacher Afternoon on Thursday, 22 April which we have extended this year to enable all parents/carers to have the opportunity to meet your child's teachers.

#### Ari Gesini Cohort 2019



Ari Gesini, born with mild cerebral palsy, became one of the youngest athletes to win a medal at the Senior Australian Nationals with his performance in long jump. At 15, Ari was selected to represent Australia at the 2017 Junior Para Athletics Championships in Switzerland, winning gold in the T38 long jump. At 17, in 2019, Ari competed for the first time in the Senior World Para Athletics Championships and finished fourth but set five personal bests along the way. His longest jump – 6.16m – now stands as the all-time Oceanic record. Ari will be competing in the Tokyo Olympics this year and has also won a prestigious Sports Australia Hall of Fame Scholarship. Ari is currently mentored by George Gregan.

## ABSENCE PROCEDURES



## PLATFORM PARCOURSUP, POST BAC STUDIES IN FRANCE




Each Year 12 student has now registered for at least one post-Baccalauréat study application on Parcoursup.

Teachers completed a document called "Fiche Avenir" for each student, which gives information about their learning outcomes and achievements to the universities in France that students have applied to.

The deadline for Year 12 students to validate their choices is **Thursday, 8 April 2021 on Parcoursup.**

## LE GRAND ORAL

**A new final exam in French Baccalauréat to develop and promote public speaking skills.**



Between **18 and 23 June**, Year 12 students will make a speech for one of their exams called "Le Grand Oral". During the final term, each student will develop a topical question which is related to their electives. Then they will research some solid arguments to answer.

Finally, they will give a 5-minute presentation about their work. The students will face a jury and will not use notes or other material in their presentation. Following the presentation jury members will spend 15 minutes asking questions about post Bac studies and future plans. The exam is about questioning, researching and developing speaking skills.

Teachers will provide support and guidance to the students throughout the term to help them prepare.

Year 12s will focus on the "Grand Oral" and more particularly oral speaking skills.

Year 11s will focus on post-Bac pathways and possibly look for work experience at the end of 2021.

We hope that your teenage child has gone well in the first session exams. While this can be a stressful time, we hope your families will have a restful Easter break and come back fresh for the next session.


### New P&C Executives

The library staff would like to draw your attention to several online facilities and opportunities that are designed to make learning easier. The library recently subscribed to Inkl a news and journalism site that contains up to date information including breaking news from around Australia and around the world. Citemaker is a bibliographic tool that assists in making and creating bibliographies and complying with academic honesty. Citemaker is simple to use, easy to master and a great help in essay and assignment tasks. Inkl and Citemaker can be accessed from the College's webpage. Further-more, students can access our 24/7 library catalogue called Oliver and our 24/7 online video site called ClickView. These can be accessed from the students' online backpack. ## HISTPHILENGPOL HAPPENINGS

On Friday of Week 6, the Year 12 Philosophy class went on an excursion to the National Museum of Australia. Our current unit focuses on the politics of knowledge and the idea of history as a contested, constructed notion. At the Museum, we visited the current exhibition: *Endeavour Voyage: The Untold Stories of Cook and the First Australians*, which tells the story of Captain Cook's landing from the perspective of Indigenous and non-Indigenous people. The students explored ideas about national identity, the divisive nature of history, the importance of perspectives, and embodied experience and knowledge. They will use this learning in their final assessment task of the session.

## LANGUAGES NEWS

### INDONESIAN

In Session 1, in which the unit of The Individual covered, our Indonesian class has explored learning activities incorporating intercultural concepts, language skills and class discussions based on the big idea "How leisure activities can contribute to positive changes to an individual". Students participated in many conversations, tried playing traditional games, expressed and shared their opinions.

The Continuing and Advanced Indonesian classes participated in many different enriching activities to further build a connection with Indonesian culture. We did this by first learning multiple traditional Indonesian games played by people of all ages. Some of these include *gasing* (spinning top) and *bekel* (jacks).

We also made our own tie-dye bags to increase our knowledge of leisure activities among Indonesian teens and traditional batik. We used the colours red, yellow and blue, used rubber bands to make patterns in the fabric, all of which created our own individual and unique bags. This was a fun and interactive way to educate ourselves and for allowing us to express ourselves whilst still learning about Indonesia and de-stress during exam periods.

### MANAGING HAZARDOUS MATERIALS IN NARRABUNDAH COLLEGE

The ACT Government is committed to ensuring all public school buildings are safe and have the infrastructure to support high-quality education.

Most ACT public schools were built at a time when asbestos and lead paint were widely used in the building industry. As [a recently published list of schools shows](#), 76 of our 89 schools have lead paint and/or asbestos. Nearly all asbestos in ACT public schools is non-friable, also known as bonded or sheet asbestos.

Narrabundah College was opened in 1960 and both lead paint and asbestos are present at our school.

We know where these materials exist, or are likely to exist, we monitor the locations regularly and we have a management strategy in place to keep our school community safe. Detailed reports are kept at the front office in a Hazardous Materials Register which you are welcome to view.

If you have any general questions about how we manage hazardous materials drop by the front office or come along to an information night at Canberra College on Tuesday 11 May from 6-8pm.

The session will include members of the Education Directorate's Hazardous Materials Taskforce, and lead paint expert Professor Mark Taylor. He is one of the specialists guiding hazardous materials work in ACT public schools ensuring our management is informed by international best practice.

The ACT Government has committed \$15 million to remove hazardous materials from public schools during the next four years. This is in addition to a school upgrade budget of \$99 million which will also help manage lead paint and asbestos.
